WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING?

Since our July meeting, much has been happening - some of which is behind the scenes. Read on.

- Efforts are ongoing to find a solution for a connection between Milford and Bradley. It does not appear possible that it will be a trail, but most likely an Access Road, aka: Route 178. This will involve approval from MDOT and a public hearing. Signatures are being sought from local residents.
- We have submitted our first financial reimbursement request from the state's Municipal Reimbursement Grant program! Approved amounts will be dispersed to our partnering Municipality, the Penobscot County Commissioners and then be passed on to us. Allowable expenses are only for trail associated costs, not for club operational expenses, and include items such as contractor work performed on the trails, materials used to maintain the trails, equipment rentals for trail maintenance, etc. We also get reimbursed for the time volunteers put in to maintain the trails, as well as certain equipment used at that time.
- Speaking of trail maintenance, a LOT of work of late has gone into maintaining our trails. Most of
 the activities have been brush clearing, tree removal and signage. Thank you for all the volunteers
 who have worked on our trail system!! You stepped up to the plate to help.
- We recently have assigned our trails a Trail Number. The trail numbers run in the '700' series 701 thru 705. We kept one N/S trail previously numbered as 512, since it appears on many already printed maps. Speaking of that, be sure to get your hands on a new map of the RMTR local trails. This letter-size map is available to you free, online on our FaceBook page or website, or can be picked up at the clubhouse anytime we're open.

EVENTS- PAST AND UPCOMING

- The planned for ATV training/safety course for young riders had to be cancelled after the weather forecast once again this year, threw us a curve ball and it decided to rain. We had a decent number of people who signed up their sons and daughters. A number of folks wished this would have met the state requirement for youth under the age of 16 to operate an ATV on public trails. That course is offered by the state and available openings are rapidly filled up. Maybe next year RMTR can arrange to be a host club for this state-run training.
- We will be hosting a <u>Bigfoot "Scavenger" Hunt"</u> on 9th and 10th of September, 3:00-6:00pm, with registration at the Clubhouse or Alexander's and finish up at the Clubhouse only. Fee is \$10/ATV. There will be prizes, raffles and fun. Join us for this event. Invite your friends!
- See us at this year's <u>Old Town Riverfest</u> on Sept 23 Yes, we will have a booth setup offering prizes, raffle opportunities, membership info, trail maps, etc. **And** we will be riding our ATVs in the annual Riverfest **parade!** So watch our FB page for more info on that neat happening.
- A hamburger/hotdog (etc) <u>BBQ</u> and <u>Joker/Poker Run</u> is on the schedule for September 30, 11:00am to 6:30, with lunch time cookout at 11:00-12:30 and dinner time BBQ at 5:00-6:30.
- Tentatively, we are considering a <u>Blue Moon club ride</u> on August 30, rain date Aug 31, and possibly a <u>BBQ and chili cookoff</u> event, that will be open to the public, sometime this fall. Stay tuned!
- And finally, on October 21, we will be having the annual <u>Land Owners Appreciation Dinner</u>, inviting all our land owners and our sponsors to a free catered meal to show our appreciation for their involvement in RMTR affairs.
